Cunard Junior High's Cell Phone/Personal Mobile Device Expectations

- Cell phones and Personal mobile devices (air pods, headphones and smart devices) are to be turned off, located in backpacks/cinch bags BEFORE entering the building.
- Cell phones and Personal mobile devices (air pods, headphones and smart devices) are to be completely away, turned off, and stored in lockers or cinch bags throughout the day (Grade 7,8). Students are NOT PERMITTED to store personal devices in their pockets, sweaters or clothing.
- Students in grades 5 and 6 will turn off and store phones in lockers/locked cabinet for the entire school day including non-instructional time.
- Cell phones and Personal mobile devices (air pods, headphones and smart devices) are not permitted in lobby's, stairwells, hallways, classrooms, gymnasiums, indoor spaces, or bathrooms. The grade 7-8 indoor lunch room during lunch is the only indoor exception.
- Pictures and videos are not permitted to be taken at school.
- Cell phones and Personal Mobile Devices are only permitted over lunch hour for grade 7 and 8 while in the lunch room and outdoors ONLY. Personal devices are not permitted in hallways, gymnasium, library or bathrooms during the lunch period.
- The Code of Conduct will apply to students who do not follow cell phone expectations

The purpose of these expectations is to minimize distractions and disruptions during learning time. When a student is not following the expectations, the following steps will be taken:

Incident Number	Administrative Action
• 1	Student will be expected to turn phone or personal device into administration to be secured for the remainder of the day and parents/guardians will be notified.

•	2	Student will be expected to turn phone or personal device into administration to be secured, and parents/guardians will be notified. The parent/guardian will be responsible for retrieving the device from the school.
•	3	Student will be expected to turn phone or personal device into administration to be secured, and parents/guardians will be notified. Third violation will be subject to the application of the Provincial Code of Conduct. The parent/guardian will be responsible for retrieving the device from the school.

Students are responsible for respecting the privacy of others and must not make others' personal information or images public. Students are not permitted to take pictures/videos/recordings unless authorized by school staff. The Nova Scotia Provincial School Code of Conduct will be applied to all students who use cell phones or personal mobile devices inappropriately or unexpectedly during the school day. Students are not permitted to answer cell phones during class time, including text messages. Phones must be turned off in accordance with the provincial policy throughout the school day.


Students in Grade 7 and 8 are able to check messages in the lunch room or outdoors at lunch.

If students are feeling unwell. They are to come to the office immediately. Together we will develop and immediate plan for notifying guardians and students can be monitored to ensure their safety while waiting for a parent/guardian to arrive.

If there is an emergency, we ask you to please contact our main office at 902-479-4418 and press 0. We kindly ask for your support. Cell phones are required to be off during the school day, so please call the main office in lieu of calling or texting your child's cell phones during the school day.

Please Review: Bus Students and Families!

The school itself does not organize or coordinate bussing. If you have questions around transportation, please contact HRCE Transportation at transportation@hrce.ca or call 902-431-4723.

Please review the following expectations if you have a student taking the school bus:

Bus Stop Safety

- Be on time for the bus and please don't run to/from the bus.
- Stand back off the road and don't push or shove when waiting at a stop.
- Always cross in front of the bus. Walk three metres (10 feet) in front of the bus to a point where you can see the driver and wait for the driver's signal to cross. Proceed to the centre of the road, STOP, LOOK & LISTEN and cross the road when it is safe.
- Never crawl under a school bus or cross the road behind the bus.
- Know the danger zones around the bus.

School Bus Safety

- Please respect and listen to the driver and avoid distracting them.
- Please keep noise levels to a minimum.
- Do not stand or move seats while the bus is in motion.
- Never put your hands, arms, feet or head out of the bus window.
- Ask the driver for permission before you open the bus windows.
- Do not throw anything inside the bus or out of the windows.
- Keep the aisle clear at all times when the bus is in motion.
- ALWAYS REMAIN SEATED
- USE OF APPROPRIATE LANGUAGE IS EXPECTED

Lunchtime

- -there are **no more microwaves** available for students at school
- -students are reminded to bring their own water bottle, and utensils as the school does not have ones to provide
- -students are expected to remain in a chair during lunchtime and not sit on the tables
- -reminder that garbage is expected to be thrown out by students into the garbage cans
- -students are expected to remain in the lunchroom not wandering the halls
- **If students are arriving late after lunch, we will be asking them to give you a call, so you are aware they are missing instructional time.

Inclement Weather

Did you know? HRCE takes great care when making the decision to alter the regular operations of schools and school buses in the event of severe or inclement weather.

It is HRCE's goal to communicate any changes to the regular operations of schools and/or buses as close to 6:00 a.m. as possible. A 6:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- · All schools are delayed in opening by two hours and bus pickups are delayed by two hours; or
- · All schools are open, but some or all busses are not operating for the day; or
- · Some schools (either individually or by family) are closed for the day; or
- · All schools are closed for the day.

If weather deteriorates, or is forecasted to worsen throughout the morning, an 11:00 a.m. announcement could be:

- · Bussed students will be picked up two hours earlier than their regular dismissal time; and
- · Walking students will be dismissed at their regularly scheduled lunch hour.
