# Greetings from the Office

From all of us at Cunard Junior High, we hope you had a wonderful and restful Holiday Break! Term 2 is now well under way and for those students who have not done as well as expected, there is still plenty of time to get enough work done to ensure they can achieve their full potential.

It is important that we continue to work together to make sure your children are focusing on their studies and working hard to the end of the school year. Remember, you can **check on your child's progress** by using your Parent Portal access to your child's **Power School**. Teachers are updating their gradebooks at least once a month so there should be evidence of work on a regular basis. In addition, our school website, <u>http://cun.hrce.ca</u> is another useful communication tool to help you keep track of school announcements and events.

If your child is going to be absent or late, please call our Safe Arrival line @ 902-421-2687. Additionally, if your child has an appointment during the school day, please contact the school to let us know. Students must always sign out at the main office before leaving the building during regular school hours.

We also ask you to continue to make sure your children are arriving to school on time and with a clean facemask each day. Children should arrive to school between 8:40-8:45 am as school begins at 8:50 am sharp. Lunch is from 11:50-12:45 pm and classes resume at 12:50pm.

Please note that **cell phone usage is not permitted during class time**. It would be greatly appreciated if this could be reinforced at home. As you know, they can be a great source of distraction when not being used for educational purposes. If students have cell phones, they are to stay in their backpacks, on silent, or powered off. Students who do not follow these expectations may lose their phones for the remainder of the day.

Just a reminder that **Cunard is a scent-free school**. Many students and staff have sensitivities. Please remind your children **not to use spray deodorants/perfumes** while at school. Parents, guardians and visitors who are coming to the school are reminded to call ahead or ring the doorbell. Someone will come assist you, **but you are unable to enter the building**. Further, in an effort to ensure we have accurate and updated information for all our students, we ask all parents and guardians to contact the main office if there are changes to home/cell phone numbers, home address, email address and health card expiry dates. Thank you in advance!

Lastly, please make sure your children are leaving for school **dressed appropriately for winter** (boots, mittens, hats and a coat) and are bringing a nutritious lunch each day if they are staying for lunch. Too many students are not bringing anything to eat and end up going hungry the rest of the day, often having less than productive afternoons. We thank you for your continued support!
